

## World2Win – a year in the project

In 2026, the first Olympic event in history takes place on the African continent: the Youth Olympic Games. World2Win (W2W) uses this momentum to build a strong connection between Europe and Africa. It serves as a catalyst for development in Senegal and between Senegal and Europe. The international dimension of sport will be promoted by the support of learning mobilities, exchanges and knowledge transfer and has a strong focus on the development of (beach)volleyball in Senegal. <u>Read more</u> about all our activities.

- Training athletes in the Back2School programme so they visit their former school and inspire children
- Organising school tournaments
- Training coaches in Volleyball4Life in order to give V4L at schools

# Successful project kick-off in Senegal

From 9-11 March 2020 the project consortium had their kick-off in Dakar, Senegal. The aim was to start the exchange, visit sites like volleyball centres, meet the players and coaches and plan the project for the upcoming two years. The EU partners learned about Senegal and the ambitious YOG plans. The first workshop was a great success and resulted in concrete plans and a strong team. A lot of interested stakeholders came to the opening at the residency of the Dutch Ambassador. This resulted in a strong network and opportunities for future partnerships. # Ndeye Fatou Sall – project manager in Senegal

To develop a strong federation, a good organisation with competent people is necessary to execute a project. Part of the W2W project is to assign a project manager in Senegal for local coordination of all the activities. Ndeye Fatou Sall was appointed as project manager and is now part of the World2Win project consortium. Ndeye is a law student at Checik Anta Diop University in Dakar. She is a former international volleyball player and currently the Secretary General of the Senegal Volleyball Federation.



# New board for Senegal Volleyball Federation

The Senegalese Federation of Volleyball organized its general assembly on Sunday, December 27, 2020 in Dakar. At the end of the elections which took place in a calm atmosphere, Mr. Amadou Anna SEYE was elected for a 4 years mandate. The former Secretary General Mrs. Ndeye Fatou SALL BA was re-elected and remains the only one left of the former executive committee. The board currently has 18 members who all have one



goal: the promotion and development of volleyball in Senegal. One of the objectives of the new board remains the implementation of a sustainable development policy with a strong priority given to youth. This among other things demonstrates the place given to the W2W project which is registered in the heart of the steps of the new Federation. The President who is a former international volleyball player has just finished his career as an international referee. He was also vice-president of the FSVB in the past.

# Volleyball4Life coaches manual developed

As part of the Volleyball4Life project of the project, a coaches manual has been developed. The manual, together with a training, will educate coaches so they can offer a grassroots volleyball programme, especially for girls. We provide the coaches and girls with volleyball drills and games, coaching and community support to build new skills, self-insight and the















opportunity to share their stories and problems. All of this results in personal development and increased decision-making power for the girls.
